How does the game work?

The game consists of 4 categories ("tradition", "daily life", "childhood", "places" and "nature"). There are questions in each category.

1. Get together in groups. The more people from different countries are in one group, the better!
2. Choose a question from the first category (tradition) and answer it / talk about it. Show pictures from Google (with your phone, laptop or via screensharing) to support your narration. Talk about as many questions as you want to.
3. Continue with the next category. If you want to, you can change groups for each category.

Is there a specific way to wear it? Is it difficult to put it on?

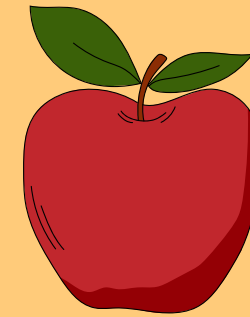
What national dishes are there in your country?

Which children's game of your country did you enjoy playing as a child?

How does the school system work in your country?

Which kinds of schools are there? Who is going to which school type?

Do you wear uniforms at school?



How does a typical day at school/kindergarten look like in your country?

What do children do in the breaks? Which kind of food is eaten? Do the children bring
food from home or can you buy food at school/kindergarten?

What is the relation between different generations like? How do they treat each other?

Is there anything it's famous for (food, festival etc)?

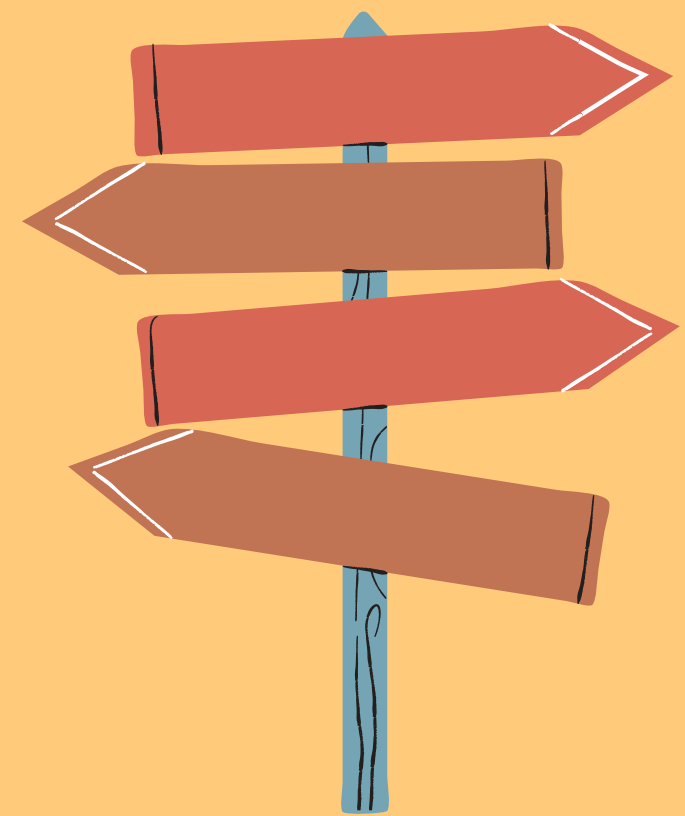
What's your favourite place there?
